Comments Update at 2000 hours July 26th Coyote Fire 460 acres and 100 Percent contained contained, control expected July 26th at 2000 hours. Now Coyote Complex due to 2 additional small fires in the immediate area. Toro Fire 1 acre, full control 7/29/06 @ 0800. Fork Fire 4 Acres 100 percent containment. Cost to date \$1,156,00 3 Firefighter injuries: 1 with mild to moderate burns transported to Arrowhead Regional Burn Center for further evaluation (minor burns to hand do to fall). 2 Heat exhaustion, treated and released. Resources will remain in the area on mop up and patrol duties as well as monitoring for new fires, there were 184 lightning strikes in the area over recent days. Assistance from California National Guard with CH47 Helicopter to shuttle full crews and

Heavy fuel, very limited access- crews being flown into fire, high temp,
erratic winds and weather.
